Monday

Rescue my shepherd from darkness to light (Col. 1:13).

Reveal the supremacy of Jesus to my shepherd (Col. 1:15-20).

Magnify Jesus in my pastor as the Hope of Glory (Col. 1:27) in preaching, in counseling, and in everyday life.

Honor my shepherd to proclaim Jesus (Col. 1:27), believing God for divine energy to teach and preach (Col. 1:29).

Wednesday

Bestow on my pastor encouragement to know the mystery of God in Christ (Col. 2:2).

Give my pastor all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge (Col. 2:3).

Allow my pastor to live in Jesus, rooted and built up with faith (Col. 2:7).

Allow my pastor to move mountains, tear down walls, inspire unity, and take this city. Let thankfulness overflow.

Thursday

Set my pastor's heart on things above (Col. 3:1). Protect his/her mind (Col. 3:2) from paranoia, fear, vain imaginations, confusion.

Loosen holiness in my pastor's life (Col. 3:5-12) ridding the works of the flesh (Col. 3:8-9). Put on this pastor (Col. 3:12) compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

Manifest your love, Lord, in my pastor (Col. 3:13). Let my pastor forgive. Fill him/her with love.

Friday

Request peace to rule in my pastor's life (Col. 3:15). Let him/her be thankful.
